

Can My Child Go to School Today?

Answer the following three questions.

1. Do you believe your child may have been in contact with another person who tested positive for COVID-19?

YES

Stay at home. Inform the school.
Call your child's health care provider.
Student must stay home 10 days from last date of contact with positive individual even if student has a negative test.

NO

2. Is your child ill with cold/flu-like symptoms? (*temperature of 100 degrees or higher, sore throat, congestion, runny nose, cough/shortness of breath/difficulty breathing, new loss of taste or smell, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea, muscle or body aches, fatigue, extreme tiredness, headache*)

YES

Stay at home. Inform the school.
Rest and Recover.
Call health care provider.

NO

3. Has your child been tested for COVID-19 and waiting for results?

YES

Stay at home until results are received.
Inform the school.

NEGATIVE COVID TEST OR OTHER DIAGNOSIS

Return to school if fever free for 24 hours and not been told to stay home due to contact with another person who has tested positive.

Give return to school note/test results from the health care provider to nurse.

NO

Come to school.

If your child has not been absent for illness, they may go directly to class.

POSITIVE COVID TEST

Stay at home for at least 10 days from when symptoms began.
Return to school only with health care provider note and when:

- **Child is fever free for 24 hours without the use of medication,**
- **AND symptoms have improved,**
- **AND it has been at least 10 days since symptoms first appeared.**

If the child never had symptoms, then return 10 days after the date of the positive test.
